FOLLOW THE STEPS

01

Every Local Church/Charge...

Sends at least one clergy and one lay person to their Annual Conference session.

02

General Conference delegates are elected.

Members from every church/charge vote on which clergy and laypersons should represent them at General Conference.

03

General Conference sets mission goals and budget for the UMC.

For the upcoming four years, what are the goals we want for the global UMC, and what will that cost to achieve them?

04

Every Annual Conference gets a fair share of the global budget.

Our General Council on Finance & Administration (GCFA) determines how much is apportioned to each conference based on a formula that includes factors like membership, economics, etc.

05

Annual Conference includes its share of the global UMC mission in their conference budget proposal.

Your conference prepares its own goals for mission and a budget to realize those mission goals. Their apportion for the global UMC is included in that budget.

06

Conference budget is approved at annual session.

Members from every church/charge have the opportunity to examine, question, and debate before they vote on a conference mission and budget they believe their church can support.

07

Each church receives a fair share portion of the conference budget.

Your Conference Council on Finance & Administration uses a formula – approved at an Annual Conference session – to determine each local church/charge's fair share portion of conference budget. This amount is included in your local church budget, which allows your church to make an impact locally, across the conference, and around the world.

TAXES

The terms "mission shares" or "ministry shares" do a much better job of describing what our connectional giving does. They heal the sick, feed the hungry, educate young people, provide comfort in the wake of disasters, and so much more.

MONEY LOST FROM MISSION


Some local churches view apportionments as money taken from their church's mission budget. In reality, participation in connectional giving gives every church, regardless of size, a larger mission footprint.
