What's Happening in the United Methodist Church?

This question was asked of your Pastor at the last Leadership Board meeting. Here is what I shared. On a denominational level, nothing has changed legislatively since Feb. 2019 Special General Conference. That said, some of the legislation that was passed and/or upheld in Feb. 2019, specifically relating to same sex marriages and guidelines for ordination and who can be a pastor are not being enforced. As you are aware, the May 2020 General Conference was postponed because of Covid19. The rescheduled General Conference will be Aug. 29th – Sept 7th 2021. It is anticipated that there will be some kind of legislation proposed and passed that will allow a split to occur in the denomination where two or more new denominations will arise. This would be how our denomination handles these issues as mentioned above. In reality there are other theological issues which have undermined our denomination as well. The main reason you have not seen a split in the denomination or churches leaving to date is because of the "Trust Clause". This clause basically says all properties (i.e. church buildings) belong to the denomination. So, if CUMC would say we wanted to leave the UMC, we could leave, but we would have to give up the church property or buy it back from the denomination if they wanted to sell it us. The legislation being proposed in 2021 would allow churches to leave and retain their property.

Closer to home. The Iowa Annual Conference is struggling financially. The conference budget suffered shortfalls in 2019 and is heading that way in 2020. The conference reserve fund is at a critically low level. Major cuts were made in the 2021 budget. However, because of numerous reasons including the uncertainty at the denomination level I see no relief in our conference's financial problems. Changes are being made in district boundaries, which will not officially all take place until July 1, 2021, but some changes are and will happen over this next year. What happens on the conference level can and will affect the local church.

Lets talk about CUMC, or as I stated at the board meeting I would prefer to talk about us as Community Church of Ogden. I believe at least on a leadership level we know who we are as a church. We have a bible based theological foundation. We believe in a Triune God – Father, Son, and Holy Spirit and there is only one way of Salvation and that is through a belief and relationship with Jesus the Christ. That we have an obligation and command to "Go and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything I (Jesus) have commanded you..." (Matt 28:19-20)

To start on that journey requires each and everyone of us to surrender ourselves (Me, Myself, and I) to our God. As the Apostle Paul stated in Galatians 2:20, "I have been crucified with Christ and I no longer live, but Christ lives in me. The life I now live in the body, I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave Himself for me." God's work starts here at the local level. We do not need to or should we wait for some authoritative edict. Our direction is guided from a higher source. I am not saying we need to abandon our Wesleyan Methodist heritage. No - We need to revive it, restore it back to its original roots that planted seeds that with the power of the Holy Spirit by its side bore fruit. This work will not be easy. It will take everyone's commitment. Don't worry about not knowing what you can do, God will direct, guide, and empower you.

The Community Church of Ogden has done great things. However, we can no longer live off the past. It is time we live in the present and push on to eternity. Are you with me and your Leadership Team? ~Pastor Buck

Wondering Thoughts from a Wayward Follower of Christ.

Blessing to you all, I love to find different ways we can use everyday items to remind us of our faith and specially to explain God to others. This one has been around for years, but worth sharing again. It is called the Deck of Cards Bible. The author of this is unknown, at least to me.

"It was quiet that day, the guns and the mortars, and land mines for some reason hadn't been heard. The young soldier knew it was Sunday, the holiest day of the week. As he was sitting there, he got out an old deck of cards and laid them out across his bunk. Just then an army sergeant came in and said, 'Why aren't you with the rest of the platoon?' The soldier replied, 'I thought I would stay behind and spend some time with the Lord.' The sergeant said, 'Looks to me like you're going to play cards.' The soldier said, 'No, sir, you see, since we are not allowed to have Bibles or other spiritual books in this country, I've decided to talk to the Lord by studying this deck of cards.' The sergeant asked in disbelief, 'How will you do that?' 'You see the Ace, Sergeant? It reminds me that there is only one God. The Two represents the two parts of the Bible, Old and New Testaments. The Three represents the Father, Son, and the Holy Ghost. The Four stands for the Four Gospels: Matthew, Mark, Luke, and John. The Five is for the five virgins... there were ten but only five of them were glorified. The Six is for the six days it took God to create the Heavens and Earth. The **Seven** is for the day God rested after making His Creation. The **Eight** is for the family of Noah... his wife, their three sons and their wives -- the eight people God spared from the flood that destroyed the Earth. The Nine is for the lepers that Jesus cleansed of leprosy He cleansed ten, but nine never thanked Him. The Ten represents the Ten Commandments that God handed down to Moses on tablets made of stone. The Jack is a reminder of Satan, one of God's first angels, but he got kicked out of heaven for his sly and wicked ways and is now the joker of eternal hell. The Queen stands for the Virgin Mary... the earthly mother of Jesus. The King stands for Jesus, for he is the King of all kings. When I count the **Dots on all the cards**, I come up with 365, one for every day of the year. There is a total of **52 cards** in a deck; each is a week - 52 weeks in a year. The 4-Suits represent the four seasons: Spring, Summer, Fall, and Winter. Each Suit has thirteen cards -- there are exactly thirteen weeks in a quarter. So, when I want to talk to God and thank Him, I just pull out this old deck of cards and they remind me of all that I have to be thankful for.' The sergeant just stood there. After a minute, with tears in his eyes and pain in his heart, he said, 'Soldier, can I borrow that deck of cards?'"

The next Walk to Emmaus is scheduled for Ankeny UMC in October.


The men's weekend is October 15-18, 2020.


